### Introduction


- Next Generation Infrastructures


- Multiple stakeholders/players/actors

## Great Brak Estuary in South Africa (1980 – 2011)


Establish whether 1 x 10<sup>6</sup> m<sup>3</sup> per annum sufficient for downstream estuary








### The policy game

Game theory provides a reflective lens







