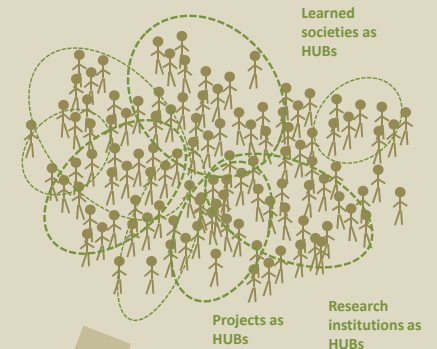


BiodiversityKnowledge is an initiative by researchers and practitioners to help all societal actors in the field of biodiversity and ecosystem services to **make better informed decisions**.

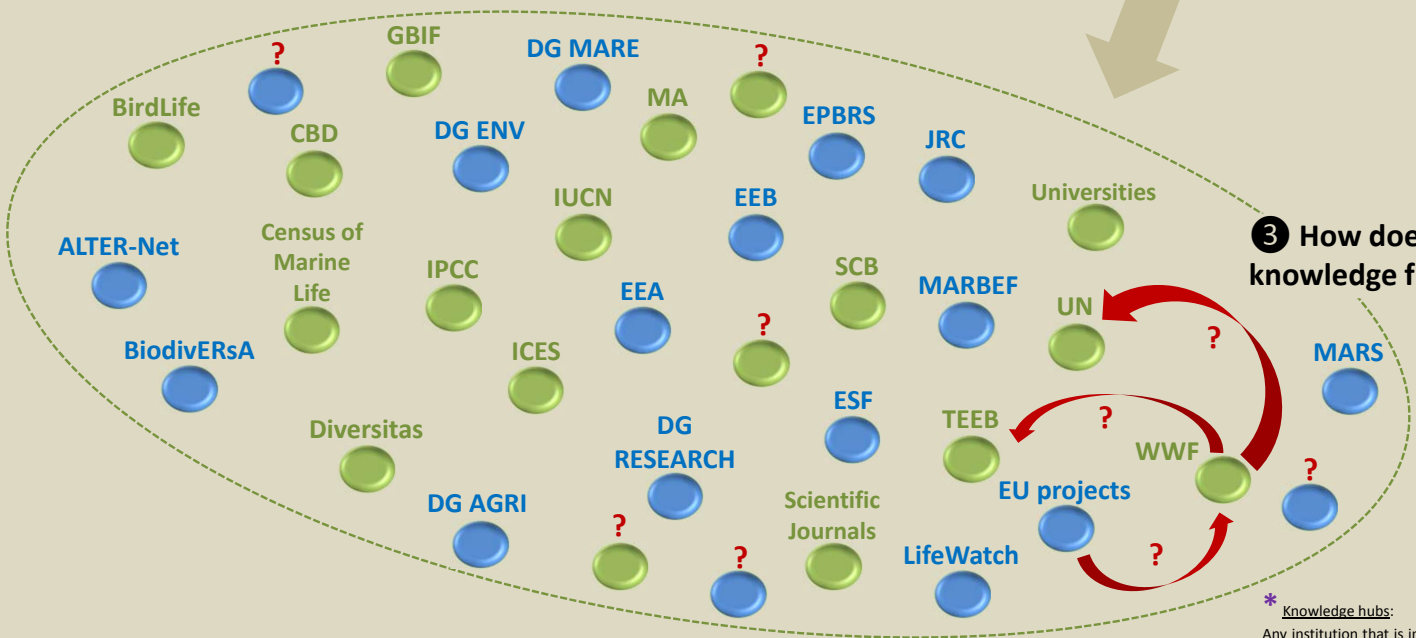
Biodiversity knowledge is scattered across disciplines, scales and a high number of different institutions and even individuals. ①
