Aim of GIFS

* The goal is to incorporate these (socio-economic) factors more explicitly into fisheries and maritime policy, coastal regeneration strategies and sustainable community development








Aim of GIFS

* GIFS will produce a geography of inshore fishing (atlas and toolkit) & a case study that will help develop shared identities, experience and best practice while bringing the issues to the attention of policy makers to aid the development of effective coastal management and fisheries policies.

Definition of inshore fishing

* GIFS: Fishing up to 12 nautical miles offshore





Why?

- * Inshore fishing is at a crossroads
- * Not enough is known about the socio-economic / cultural impacts of inshore fishing
- * Explore the wide range of 'values' associated with inshore fishing
- Reveal, share and disseminate new opportunities for sustainable development of coastal fishing communities



Main activities




Purpose of today
